Who... Paul and Kelly Carline

Paul was born in England but his father's work allowed the family to live in Kuwait and the Bahamas. They moved to Canada in 1975 where the whole family came to Christ and were baptized. Paul holds a Bachelor degree from Prairie Bible Institute (PBI) and later studied at Moody Graduate School and Carey Theological College.

Kelly was born in Vancouver, BC, but grew up in Japan, where her parents were missionaries. She came to faith in Christ and was baptized as a young girl. After receiving her Bachelor's degree from Prairie Bible Institute, she taught English in China for a year and a half.

Paul and Kelly met at PBI. They thank God for the opportunity they had to pastor a church for 6 years in Paul's home town in New Brunswick and for the subsequent years in cross cultural mission. The Carlines have four children - Katie, Kara, Kelvin and Kenan.

Where... Kenya, Africa

When... Paul and Kelly Carline were appointed as CBM Global Field Staff in 1995.

What... The Carlines were appointed to do outreach ministries in the Northeast Province of Kenya. In 1997, the work expanded to include urban development in Eastleigh, Nairobi. In addition to witness through relationship and community good-will building, Paul and Kelly coordinate The Sharing Way development projects, teach ESL, and encourage the Kenyan and Canadian church in cross cultural outreach.

From a Carline March 2009 update:

Yattani and his wife, Salome, now work alongside CBM Global Field Staff in North Eastern Province. Paul writes, "I so enjoy watching him skillfully interact with the varied peoples."

Pray for Yattani and Salome - as they adjust to married life - as they meet new people and build friendships, as they interact with and guide the community groups, and as they learn many things - how to listen, speak, share Jesus, shop, drive, file reports.

Pray for Aaron and Erica Kenny who also serve as CBM Global Field Staff in this area of Kenya.

Pray for Kenya - as rains are needed, as food prices climb, as people go hungry. Millions are experiencing hunger due to severe drought.

Pray for the Carlines - as "we emerge from a year of a lost vehicle, lost hard drives, lost work, lost money, lost health (we're okay now), a lost daughter (to college), a lost Dad (to heaven), as we seek to learn our lessons and walk more humbly with our God."

From Carline July 2009 update:

"We are having lots of talks and meetings these days around the possibility of growing our team and increasing our presence in NEP. There are so many needs and opportunities; Yattani and Salome need help.

For example, every month Christians/surgeons operate on children in the Dadaab refugee camps (the largest refugee settlement in the world). Yattani works on the ground as their patient coordinator but is not able to facilitate the necessary pre and post op care. Also the families touched have wide open doors and hearts and really need to be visited and told that it was Jesus and his people who have blessed them. They also need an opportunity to say thank you and give someone a cup of tea for these wonderful free surgeries (cleft palates, club feet, hydrocephalic heads, etc.)

Pray for the Lord of the Harvest to continue to send laborers into his harvest field.

Yattani and Salome are in Garissa giving rice, beans and oil to 50 poor families around the primary school in Buula Iftiin where we also feed the 160 children lunch each day.

The Golloos love these people and love helping them but there is a sting - their own families further up North towards the Ethiopian border are also hungry and in need of food. So they give with tears in their eyes, thinking of their fathers, mothers, sisters and brothers, trying to trust God that they too will be miraculously sustained until the Lord brings rain on the land. *Give and it will be given unto you....* Yattani and Salome are clinging to Jesus' promise."

Why... 30 years ago, CBM entered North East Province as one of the few players working and weeping in Jesus' name. Today God has put his Spirit on many internationals and even more Kenyans to live and love for him there.
